

## Lecture Outline: Spanish Informal Affirmative Tú Commands

### **Affirmative Tú (Informal) Commands**

- tell someone to do something using the familiar subject pronoun “tú”
- verbs use the present indicative “usted” form
- subject pronoun “tú” can be used after the verb to add emphasis to the command
- direct & indirect object pronouns are attached to the end of the verb
- when DO and IO pronouns are placed on the verb, accent mark is added to the verb if needed to maintain correct pronunciation of the verb
- commands are called “mandatos” in Spanish

### **Irregular Affirmative Tú Verbs**

poner	pon
tener	ten
venir	ven
hacer	haz
salir	sal
decir	di
saber	sé
ir	ve

### Spanish Affirmative Tú Informal Commands

Habla por el celular. <i>Talk on the cell phone.</i>	
Habla tú por el celular. <i>Talk on the cell phone. (emphatic)</i>	
Escribe un mensaje. <i>Write a message.</i>	
Escribe tú un mensaje. <i>Write a message. (emphatic)</i>	
Pide la cuenta. <i>Ask for the bill.</i>	
Ponlo en la mesa. <i>Put it on the table.</i>	
Escríbelo. <i>Write it.</i>	
Ven aquí. <i>Come here.</i>	
Dime la verdad. <i>Tell me the truth.</i>
