Usted (Formal) & Negative Tú (Informal) Commands	Irregular Subjunctive Verbs (usted, ustedes, neg. tú)	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> tell someone to do or not to do something (affirmative or negative command) using the formal subject pronouns usted & ustedes OR tell someone not to do something (negative command) using the familiar subject pronoun "tú" 	estar	estés, esté, estén
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> verbs use the subjunctive usted, ustedes, & tú forms 	ser	seas, sea, sean
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> subject pronouns can be used after the verb to add emphasis to the command 	ir	vayas, vaya, vayan
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> direct & indirect object pronouns are attached to the end of the verb with affirmative commands, & precede the verb with negative commands 	saber	sepas, sepa, sepan
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> when DO and IO pronouns are placed on the verb, accent mark is added to the verb if needed to maintain correct pronunciation of the verb 	dar	des, de, den
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> commands are called "mandatos" in Spanish 	-car (sacar)	-que (saques, saque, saquen)
	-gar (apagar)	-gue (apagues, apague, apaguen)
	-zar (almorzar)	-ce (almuerces, almuerce, almuercen)

Forming Subjunctive Verbs for Usted, Usteds (Formal) & Negative Tú (Informal) Commands

- use the "yo" present indicative verb without the "o"
- "-ar" verbs add "-es, -e, -en" for tú, usted, ustedes
- "-er" & "-ir" verbs add "-as, -a, -an" for tú, usted, ustedes

<p>No vayas a la fiesta esta noche. <i>Don't go to the party tonight. (you informal/familiar)</i></p>	
<p>¡Trabjen rápidamente! <i>Work quickly! (you plural/you-all)</i></p>	
<p>Practique el español. <i>Practice Spanish. (you formal)</i></p>	
<p>No camines tú al centro. <i>Don't walk downtown. (you informal, emphatic)</i></p>	
<p>¡Ábrenla ustedes ahora mismo! <i>Open it right now! (you-all/you plural, emphatic, the door)</i></p>	
<p>No seas tonto. <i>Don't be silly. (you informal/familiar)</i></p>	
<p>Vengan ustedes con nosotras. <i>Come with us? (you formal, plural, emphatic)</i></p>	
<p>Por favor, comiencen a las 4:00. <i>Please, start at 4:00. (you plural/you-all)</i></p>	
<p>Ponga la luz, por favor. <i>Turn on the lights, please. (you formal)</i></p>	
<p>No ensucien ustedes la concina. <i>Don't get the kitchen dirty. (you plura/you-all, empahitic)</i></p>	
<p>No apagues tú las luces cuando estoy estudiando. <i>Don't turn off the lights when I'm studying. (you informal, emphatic)</i></p>	
<p>Quiten ustedes el polvo del estante. <i>Dust the bookshelves. (you-all/you plural, emphatic)</i></p>
