Verb Endings Conditional Tense • add conditional tense verb endings to the infinitive form of the verb -ía some verbs are irregular (like tener) tú - ías **Used to express:** usted, él, ella - ía actions that would have happened given/depending on a particular condition nosotros, - íamos nosotras polite request ustedes, ellos, - ían English conditional tense uses the word "would" with another verb ellas The imperfect tense in Spanish is used when describing an action that occurred on a regular basis. (NOT the conditional tense)

I thought he would arrive today.	
(Yo) pensaba que (él) llegaría hoy. (conditional tense)	
We didn't know he'd have to go.	
No sabíamos que (él) tendría que ir. (conditional tense)	
Would you please study tonight?	
¿Estudiarías esta noche, por favor? (conditional tense)	
Action that occurred on a regular basis in the past:	
They used to read every day.	
They would read every day.	
<u>IMPERFECT TENSE</u> : Leían todos los días.
