

Worksheet: Spanish Direct Object Pronouns

- Direct object pronouns in Spanish sentences can always be placed immediately before the conjugated verb
- The direct object can remain in the sentence
- When an infinitive verb immediately follows a conjugated verb, direct object pronouns can attach to the end of the infinitive verb
- With a present progressive verb phrase, direct object pronouns can attach to the end of the participle
- When a direct object pronoun is attached to the end of a verb, sometimes an accent mark is added to the verb in order to preserve the original emphasis on the correct syllable
- The direct object pronouns la, las, and los are often confused with singular feminine "the" (la), plural feminine "the" (las), and plural masculine "the" (los)
