

Answers for Worksheet: Spanish Present Perfect

<u>Present Perfect Tense</u> – expresses recent past actions - conjugate haber + past participle - past participles always end in “o” (do NOT change gender or number) - some past participles are irregular (like ver) “ha habido” is used to describe general existence (there have been, there has been) - expressed in English using have/has + past participle	<u>haber conjugations</u>	
	yo	he
	tú	has
	usted, él, ella	ha
	nosotros, nosotras	hemos
	ustedes, ellos, ellas	han

They have been few patients at the clinic. <i>Ha habido pocos pacientes en la clínica.</i>	
Why haven't you arrived at class yet? (informal) <i>¿Por qué no has llegado a clase todavía?</i>	
We have worked a lot. <i>Hemos trabajado muchísimo.</i>	
You haven't done your homework. (plural) <i>No han hecho la tarea.</i>	
Have you visited King's Island? (formal) <i>¿Ha usted visitado a King's Island?</i>	
My cousins have met your brother. <i>Mis primos han conocido a su hermano.</i>	
I have written a letter to the coach. <i>He escrito una carta al entrenador.</i>	
Have you and Miguel put the cake in the oven? <i>¿Han puesto tú y Miguel la torta en el horno?</i>	
Angel and I have run many miles through the city. <i>Ángel y yo hemos corrido muchas millas por la ciudad.</i>	
We're going home because we've forgotten the books. <i>Vamos a casa porque se nos han olvidado los libros.</i>	
He has said that he knows how to play the guitar. <i>Él ha dicho que sabe tocar la guitarra.</i>	
She has looked for her cat since December. <i>Ella ha buscado su gato desde diciembre.</i>	
The whole family has eaten apple pie. <i>Toda la familia ha comido el pastel de manzana.</i>	
Why hasn't she thought about it? <i>¿Por qué no lo ha pensado ella?</i>
